Childhood Immunizations

The number of children receiving timely vaccinations fell significantly during the COVID-19 pandemic. Though not as severe as national levels, the Finger Lakes Region also experienced a significant decrease. The American Academy of Pediatrics and Georgetown University's Center for Children and Families outlined the need to refocus on childhood vaccinations as we emerge from the COVID-19 pandemic. Well Child 15-30 Months

Extra, Extra Pharmacy Savings: The 2023 Pharmacy Savings Program focuses on switching patients to less costly alternatives in four medication classes when clinically appropriate: Insulin Lispro, Long-Acting Insulin, Metformin ER, and NSAIDs. Providers earn the maximum incentive when their rate of prescribing lower-cost alternatives for each medication class is better than the established overall network baseline. For providers whose performance is below the network baseline, a portion of the incentive can still be earned as long as the performance represents an improvement from the provider's prior year performance. Providers also have an opportunity to collaborate with the Pharmacy team to identify patients for whom switching is clinically inappropriate to remove those patients from the provider's performance calculation. The 2023 Pharmacy Savings Program is identical to the 2022 performance year to allow for more robust engagement, which was limited last year due to data disruptions and delays.
